Position Overview

The Board Treasurer will work closely with fellow board members, staff, and the school's director to support the school's mission and long-term vision, with particular attention paid to the school's finances and financial health. This is a **volunteer position**, ideal for someone who values education, innovative governance practices, and community building.

Responsibilities

- **Budget Development:** Work closely with the head of school to create and review the school's annual budget. In addition, the Treasurer helps ensure that the school's spending and fund-raising aligns with its priorities and resources.
- **Financial Oversight**: Ensure that the school's finances and financial planning are properly managed. Responsibilities include regularly reviewing financial statements and budgets, as well as ensuring that funds are used effectively to support the school's

mission. The Treasurer also monitors the cash flow to ensure the school has enough liquidity to meet its short-term obligations.

- **Reporting**: Provide financial updates at board meetings. This includes presenting financial statements, explaining key financial trends, and offering insights about the financial status of the school.
- **Compliance and Risk Management**: Ensure that the school adheres to all financial and tax regulations, and manage any financial risks, such as liabilities or potential funding shortfalls.

Desired Qualifications

- Financial expertise, particularly with accounting and budgeting for small nonprofits.
- Attention to detail and ethical integrity.
- Strong organization and communication skills.
- Familiarity or interest in sociocracy, consensus-based governance, or democratic leadership. Familiarity with non-profit or educational boards is a plus, but not required.
- A passion for education and supporting young people.

- Attend quarterly board meetings (in person or virtually).
- Engage in committee work and school events as needed.
- Serve a renewable 1–3 year term.
